School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it? This is a plan that describes how Oakwood Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Oakwood Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Oakwood Elementary will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised? Oakwood Elementary invites all parents to attend an annual parent and family engagement input meeting, in the Spring, to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the school/district comprehensive needs assessment, school/district improvement plans, school-parent compact, and the parent and family engagement budget. Additionally, our school welcomes parent input and comments at any time during the school year regarding this plan. All parent feedback received during the school year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and post feedback throughout the year. We also distribute an annual survey online and make paper copies available for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parent and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year.

Who is it for? All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Oakwood Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available? At the beginning of the year, after revision, the plan is posted on the school's website, emailed through Remind Message, presented at the Annual Title I meeting, and paper copies are provided in the school's front office.

What is Title I?

Oakwood Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging State academic standards in order to reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with all parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.

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District Goals

- By the end of FY25, the percentage of students in each subgroup moving into the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels of performance on the Georgia Milestones Assessments will increase by 2% in the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels of performance.
- By the end of FY25, increase the percentage of referred students who access school based mental health services in order to increase the overall school climate rating for HCSD by 1%.

School Goals

- During the 2024-2025 school year, the percentage of students in each grade level that met or exceeded their projected student norms growth goal for reading in the Spring 2025 will increase by 2%, thus impacting overall achievement. This will be measured by the data collected in the Spring 2025 student growth summary report of the NWEA MAP for Reading and compared to the same report from Spring 2024.
- For FY24-25, there will be a 10% increase in parent communication and participation at school events when comparing FY23-24 to FY24-25 as measured by event sign in sheets and parent feedback surveys.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Oakwood Elementary and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop together that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students and teachers during the parent input meeting. The school-parent compacts are shared through the Annual Title I meeting, Remind, and posted on the school's website. The school-parent compacts are kept in the main office if parents need another copy.

Parental Involvement Policy

Oakwood Elementary will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. The school will ensure that-

1. All parents and families are invited to parent involvement meetings throughout the school year.
2. The school hosts an Annual Title I Meeting. During this meeting we share information about our Title I program. The information shared includes: our parent and family engagement policy, the schoolwide plan, the school-parent compacts, and parents' requirements.
3. An open house time is planned before school starts in the fall to provide parents, families and students the opportunity to tour the school, meet new teachers, and learn about school programs. The media center sponsors a book fair family night to encourage parents and families to become involved in their child's selection of reading material.
4. Parents and families are encouraged to participate in various parent involvement activities and parent workshops. Parent and family volunteers are encouraged to help teachers and students enhance the learning environment.
5. Oakwood strives to maintain open lines of communication. We ensure that information related to school and parent programs, meetings and other activities is published in English and Spanish on the school's website, social media, and flyers.
6. Teachers maintain web pages. Teachers also choose to communicate using other methods such as text, email, or communication apps.
7. Teachers and staff are available for conferences by appointment. Contact your child's teacher any time to get updates on behaviors or academics.
8. Participate in Canvas professional development modules at least four times per year to educate staff on strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement.
9. Oakwood Elementary operates under an open door policy. The principal and assistant principal are always available to meet with parents and families to discuss student concerns, parent concerns, the curriculum, and improvement of programs.
10. The Oakwood Parent Leadership Team which includes teachers, parents, administration, and business leaders, reviews school programs and concerns.
11. A teacher-student-parent compact outlines how teachers, parents, and students will share the responsibility for improved student achievement. Results of academic assessments are shared with parents and students.
12. School personnel will provide assistance to parents and families in understanding state academic standards and state and local assessments.
13. The school counselor assist parents and families in understanding student services offered through the school system and in the community that may help meet specific student or family needs.
14. Parent involvement programs for parents and families are offered by the parent liaison..
15. Partner with Head Start through the District Parent Outreach Facilitator. The District Parent Outreach Facilitator meets with parents and families providing information and resources to support school orientation for parents, families and students to assist in successful student transitions to kindergarten.
16. Partner with the middle schools to provide parents and families as well as students with information and resources pertaining to successful transition to middle school.
