Hall County School System Goals:

By the end of FY25, the percentage of students in each subgroup moving into the "Proficient" and Distinguished" levels of performance on the Georgia Milestones Assessments will increase by 2% in the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels of performance.

By the end of FY25, increase the percentage of referred students who access school based mental health services in order to increase the overall school climate rating for HCSD by 1%.

Oakwood Elementary Goals:

During the 2024-2025 school year, the percentage of students in each grade level that met or exceeded their projected student norms growth goal for reading in the Spring 2025 will increase by 2%, thus impacting overall achievement. This will be measured by the data collected in the Spring 2025 student growth summary report of the NWEA MAP for Reading and compared to the same report from Spring 2024.

For FY24-25, there will be a 10% increase in parent communication and participation at school events when comparing FY23-24 to FY24-25 as measured by event sign in sheets and parent feedback surveys.
